



WELCOME SPRING!



Now that Spring is here, the Road Districts first priorities in the Spring (when the weather has turned) is to get our spring cleaning and mailbox repairs taken care of. You will see our crews sweeping and raking intersections, turnarounds, and areas where snow was piled up that created plow scars. Drains that have been clogged will be cleaned along with any cross culvert that might need to be opened. Any broken mailbox posts from the plow trucks or from the snow will be repaired properly or replaced with a new post.

The Road District is now transitioning to our spring/summer schedule with the light winter weather that we were so lucky to have gone through this year. You will start seeing our machines working on the roads and ditches as we are trying to get a head start on our summer work. Like in the past years we will be performing ditch improvements, replacing culverts, and paving many roads throughout the summer until the weather changes next fall. If you happen to see JULIE locate flags, please do not remove them as we have two weeks to perform the work that was called in for that locate. The flags are very important as they help identify underground utilities. If you see any of our crew, please slow down and watch carefully for workers.

Unfortunately, Nunda Township Road District does not except paint for recycling any longer. Due to the paint program contract with the IEPA expiring 12/31/23, Nunda Township Road District would have to pay to have the paint properly disposed of and recycled, which is very costly. There is a new statewide paint recycling program becoming available in 2025. See our website for updated details. We do not take TV.s or monitors. Our mulch pile is located on Pleasant Hill at Anita Sherwood Park and is self-serve. We will be loading mulch here at 3518 Bay Road, location on Saturdays only from 7:00 a.m. - Noon from April through October. The road district will continue to deliver mulch to seniors and or veterans, call to be scheduled. The following **CAN** be dropped off:

- Cans – Aluminum and Metal
- Glass Bottles and Jars
- Plastic Bottles and Jugs
- Newspaper, Cardboard, and Magazines
- Landscape, Brush, Sticks and Branches
- Scrap Steel
- Electronics (no T.V.'s or Monitors)
- Light Bulbs
- Waste Oils
- Tires - *Saturdays Only 7am-12pm*
- Oil Recycling - *Nunda Township Road District accepts used motor oil for recycling all year around during regular business hours. Only waste oil will be accepted, no anti-freeze or other chemicals are allowed.*
- Clothes donation bins are back!



Car and truck batteries are accepted. All other batteries can be brought to [Batteries Plus](#) for recycling, some fees may apply.

Scheduled volunteer work hours are Monday, Wednesday and Saturday mornings, although many people come at other times to help as their schedules allow. Once the first crops are ready, distribution begins. This season Nunda Garden plans to donate to the Family Health Partnership, Holy Apostles Church, and the Illinois Migrant Council.
