RESOLUTION NO. 05-21-25-01

RESOLUTION ASSIGNING MIKE SHORTEN AS SIGNATURE OF RECORD FOR NUNDA TOWNSHIP BANKING ACCOUNTS

WHEREAS, Mike Shorten was duly elected as Nunda Township Supervisor at the consolidated election held on April 1, 2025, and said election was certified by the McHenry County Clerk, and Mike Shorten took office as Nunda Township Supervisor effective May 19, 2025; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Illinois Township Code (60 ILCS 1/70-5 and 60 ILCS 1/70-15), the Township Supervisor serves as the treasurer of the township and is responsible for the management and oversight of all township funds, including the authority to sign checks and other financial instruments; and

WHEREAS, the Township Supervisor, as treasurer, is responsible for the financial accounts of the Nunda Township General Town Fund, General Assistance Fund, and any other funds established by the township for its operations; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Illinois Township Code (60 ILCS 1/235-5), the Township Supervisor manages funds related to the Nunda Township Cemetery District, including any banking accounts established for cemetery maintenance and operations; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Illinois Highway Code (605 ILCS 5/6-501), the Township Supervisor serves as the treasurer for the Nunda Township Road District, managing its financial accounts and ensuring proper disbursement of road district funds; and

WHEREAS, the Nunda Township Board of Trustees deems it necessary and appropriate to designate Mike Shorten, as the duly elected Township Supervisor, as the signature of record for all banking accounts associated with Nunda Township, the Nunda Township Road District, the Nunda Township Cemetery District, and any other accounts for which the Township Supervisor serves as treasurer under Illinois law; and

WHEREAS, this designation ensures compliance with Illinois state statutes and facilitates the efficient administration of township financial operations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Nunda Township, McHenry County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: Designation of Signature of Record

Mike Shorten, as the duly elected Nunda Township Supervisor, is hereby designated as the signature of record for all banking accounts associated with:

- Nunda Township, including but not limited to the General Town Fund and General Assistance Fund;
- Nunda Township Road District;
- Nunda Township Cemetery District;
- Any other accounts for which the Township Supervisor serves as treasurer pursuant to Illinois state statutes.

Section 2: Authority and Responsibilities

Mike Shorten, as Township Supervisor and treasurer, is authorized to sign checks, approve financial transactions, and manage all banking activities for the aforementioned accounts in accordance with Illinois law and township policies.

Section 3: Notification to Financial Institutions

The Nunda Township Clerk is directed to provide a certified copy of this Resolution to all financial institutions holding accounts for Nunda Township, the Nunda Township Road District, the Nunda Township Cemetery District, and any other relevant township funds, to ensure that Mike Shorten is recognized as the authorized signature of record.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TOWNSHIP SUPERVISOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH ZUKOWSKI, ROGERS, FLOOD & McARDLE AS TOWNSHIP ATTORNEY AND APPROVING TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT WITH ANCEL GLINK

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Illinois Township Code (60 ILCS 1/70-30), the Township Supervisor, with the advice and consent of the Board of Trustees, is authorized to appoint and contract professional services, including legal counsel, to serve the needs of Nunda Township; and

WHEREAS, the Nunda Township Board of Trustees has determined that it is in the best interest of the township to engage the services of Zukowski, Rogers, Flood & McArdle as the Township Attorney to provide legal counsel and representation; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees further recognizes the need to terminate the existing agreement with Ancel Glink, the current provider of legal services to Nunda Township, in accordance with the terms of that agreement; and

WHEREAS, the appointment of Zukowski, Rogers, Flood & McArdle and the termination of the agreement with Ancel Glink will ensure that the township's legal needs are met efficiently and effectively; and

WHEREAS, the Township Supervisor requires authorization from the Board of Trustees to enter into a new agreement with Zukowski, Rogers, Flood & McArdle and to execute any necessary documents to effectuate the termination of the agreement with Ancel Glink;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Nunda Township, McHenry County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: Authorization to Enter Agreement

The Township Supervisor is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with Zukowski, Rogers, Flood & McArdle to serve as the Township Attorney for Nunda Township, subject to the terms and conditions approved by the Board of Trustees.

Section 2: Approval of Termination

The termination of the existing agreement with Ancel Glink for legal services is hereby approved, and the Township Supervisor is authorized to execute any documents necessary to effectuate said termination in accordance with the terms of the agreement.

Section 3: Execution of Documents

The Township Supervisor is authorized to sign, execute, and deliver any contracts, agreements, or other documents necessary to implement the appointment of Zukowski, Rogers, Flood & McArdle as Township Attorney and to complete the termination of the agreement with Ancel Glink.

NUNDA TOWNSHIP LEGAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS LEGAL SERVICES AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") dated May _____, 2025 by and between Nunda Township ("Township") and ZRFM, LLC, an Illinois limited liability company, ("Attorney") (the Township and the Attorney are each a "Party" and collectively the "Parties").

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 70-37 of the Illinois Township Code, the Supervisor, by and with the advice and consent of the Township Board desires to appoint an attorney to represent the Township and the Attorney desires to represent the Township.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the recitals, mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. Legal Services: The Attorney agrees to provide legal services consisting of: attending Township Board meetings; serving as general counsel to the Township; be the legal advisor of the Township, and render advice on legal questions affecting the Township; representing the Township in general corporate legal matters and ensuring Township compliance with the requirements of FOIA, the Open Meetings Act, the Gift Ban Act, and conflict of interest laws; responding in a timely manner to inquiries from authorized Township departments and/or elected officials; drafting, reviewing and/or negotiating contracts, in whole or in part, and activities incidental or related thereto, including, but not necessarily limited to, real-estate transactions, intergovernmental agreements, professional services, purchasing, service or product contracts, as requested; and providing research, recommendations, written legal opinions, preparation and review of issues relating to Township matters. The Attorney represents that all attorneys providing legal services hereunder are duly licensed to practice law in Illinois, are in good standing and shall perform and complete all legal services in a professional manner consistent with the professional standards of practice, care and diligence of attorneys representing municipalities in the Chicago Metropolitan Area.
- 2. <u>Compensation:</u> The Attorney's compensation for legal services shall be at the rate of \$210 per hour, billed in quarter hour increments. The Attorney shall provide the Township with a statement, in a format approved by the Township, covering the legal services performed in the prior month or such other time period as is agreed to between the Township Supervisor and the Attorney. Each statement shall describe each task and the time spent on such task with respect to any legal services.
- 3. Reimbursement of Expenses: The Attorney shall be reimbursed for costs advanced and other reimbursable expenses such as court filing fees, court reporter chargers, subpoena fees, document recording fees, etc. Reimbursable expenses shall be described on each statement covering the period when they were incurred. Upon request, the Attorney shall provide the Township with copies of invoices and other records relating to such expenses.
- 4. **Payment:** Payment shall be made by the Township within thirty (30) days after each statement is approved for payment at a Township Board meeting.

- 5. <u>Commencement and Performance of Legal Services:</u> The Attorney shall commence providing legal services upon this Agreement being fully executed by the Parties.
- 6. <u>Independent Contractor:</u> The Attorney shall provide legal services hereunder as an independent contractor and shall not be considered as an official, employee, agent, partner or joint venturer of the Township for any purpose. As an independent contractor, the Attorney shall not be entitled to any pension, health insurance or other employee benefits and the Township shall not be obligated to pay FICA or withhold taxes on any payments made to the Attorney.
- 7. <u>Term:</u> The term of this Agreement shall continue until it is terminated. The Supervisor and Township Board may terminate this Agreement at any time without cause or reason upon the Township giving written notice to the Attorney. The Attorney may terminate this Agreement at any time without cause or reason upon giving a 60-day written notice to the Township, unless the Township Supervisor and Attorney agree to a shorter notice period.
- 8. **Professional Liability Insurance:** The Attorney represents that all attorneys providing legal services hereunder are covered by a professional liability insurance policy in the amount of not less than \$5,000,000.00 with a deductible of not more than \$35,000.00; such insurance policy shall provide coverage on a claims made basis. During the term of this Agreement and for one-year following its termination, the Attorney shall maintain such insurance coverage in full force and effect.
